

DIES WRAPPING GIFTS

**Dr. S. Terese Weisner, Chiropodist,
Found Lifeless With Hand On
Xmas Present For Relative.**

WORRIED OVER FAR-OFF KIN

**Despoiled By Pickpocket While On
Shopping Trip To Help Fam-
ily In Hungary.**

Dr. S. Terese Weisner, chiropodist, 327 North Charles street, was found dead this morning shortly before 2 o'clock by her husband, Samuel Weisner, a Swedish masseur, in the kitchen of their home, where she had been preparing Christmas presents for destitute relatives in Hungary.

Grief over the plight of her relatives in Hungary is thought by her husband to have been responsible for her death. She was 50 years old and of robust stature. Recently she received word from her brother that his home had been looted by Roumanians and clothing and food, the only things the brother had in his home, carried off by the bandits.

Dr. Weisner had planned to send money and necessaries to the relatives. Two weeks ago she left her Charles street office to procure articles to be sent abroad, but a thief stole her pocketbook with \$50 in the vicinity of Lexington Market. She reported her loss to Detective Captain McGovern.

Last night Dr. Weisner had collected a number of articles as Christmas presents. Her husband retired about 10 o'clock, leaving his wife in the kitchen wrapping the packages. About 2 o'clock he awakened, and, noticing a light in the kitchen, investigated. He found his wife dead, seated in a chair with a hand on one of the packages.
